CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Summer Term 2- Year 1 Golden Class



READING

In phonics we will be continuing to learn set 2 and 3 special friends.
Children will be listening to and discussing stories whilst learning new vocabulary: cats - Eleanor Farjeon, Voices in the park - Anthony Browne, and The owl who was afraid of the dark - Jill Thomlinson.



WRITING

The children will be developing their writing skills, specifically creating a coherent sentence.



MATHS

The children build on their number skills by working with numbers up to 100, developing confidence in addition and subtraction, and beginning to understand multiplication through grouping and sharing. They also learn about time, money, measurement, and basic geometry, while explaining their thinking and solving simple real-life problems.



SCIENCE

this term the children will be reviewing their learning from throughout the year, as well as taking part in Science week.



HISTORY

Pupils will develop their understanding of geography by locating continents, oceans, and the UK using maps, globes and atlases, while beginning to use directional language and simple compass points. They will compare their local area with a contrasting non-European location, recognise and describe physical and human features (including on aerial photographs), and create simple labelled sketch maps to represent places and features they observe in their school and local environment.



DT

Year 1 and 2 will be investigating strength and stability - designing and making a chair for Baby Bear.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PE)

In PE, year 1 and 2 will be practising fitness and athletics with summer ball games too.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (RE)

RE, year 1 and 2 will be thinking about - What makes some places special to believers?



MUSIC

In Music years 1 and 2 will be learning about pitch with our topic Music Me.



COMPUTING

Pupils will develop basic computing skills by collecting, representing and interpreting data in a variety of formats (including pictograms, charts and branching databases) using both physical objects and digital tools, while also learning to log in, navigate a computer and consider how different inputs are used when designing technology.



PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH AND ECONOMIC EDUCATION (PSHE)

This half term year 1 and 2 will be continuing to learn about citizenship and then move onto Economic Wellbeing.
